Dear Dr. Steinfeld:

The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has determined that your facility meets the requirements for certification under the Mammography Quality Standards Act of 1992 (MQSA) as amended by subsequent Mammography Quality Standards Reauthorization Acts (MQSRA). The enclosed MQSA certificate certifies your facility as a lawful provider of mammography services until the expiration date on the certificate or in the event of certificate suspension or revocation. If your accreditation body (AB) subsequently denies accreditation, FDA will notify you regarding your status as a certified facility. You may dispose of or file any MQSA certificate previously held by your facility.

MQSA certification authorizes a facility to lawfully perform mammography including: operation of x-ray equipment to produce mammograms; processing of films; interpretation of mammograms; medical record keeping; reporting and patient notification; and outcomes data collection.

Furthermore, as a certified mammography facility, you must:

- uphold the requirements of the MQSA;
- obtain and/or maintain facility accreditation with an FDA-approved AB (e.g., the American College of Radiology or the States of Arkansas, Iowa and Texas) and notify them of status changes (e.g., additions or changes in equipment or personnel, facility mailing or physical address, facility location, official contacts or services provided);
- prominently display the facility's MQSA certificate in view of mammography patients;
- undergo annual MQSA inspections and re-inspections (if necessary); and,
- pay associated MQSA inspection fees, when billed by FDA.

You must cease performing mammography services immediately and no longer display the certificate if the certificate expires or is suspended or revoked. If you wish to resume offering mammography services, you must contact your FDA-approved AB or, in the

case of suspension or revocation, the FDA to pursue your facility's options. If your accreditation body (AB) subsequently denies accreditation, FDA will notify you regarding your status as a certified facility.

If FDA determines that your facility at any time performed mammography without a valid certificate, you could be subject to sanctions under MQSA. These sanctions include

- civil money penalties of up to \$11,000 per violation per day for performing mammography without a valid certificate (42 U.S.C. 263b(h)(3)),
- suspension or revocation of certification (42 U.S.C. 263b(i)), and;
- injunction proceedings by FDA against your facility (42 U.S.C. 263b(j)).


Also, without a valid certificate, reimbursement ceases for diagnostic or screening mammography services from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS).
